

Are you interested in participating in clinical research related to your recovery?

The National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) is conducting a research study looking at brain imaging changes at the start of sobriety in physicians and other health professionals participating in a Physicians Health Program (PHP) or equivalent.

- •The study includes an ONLINE-only component, with total participation about 4-7 hours
- •Eligible participants may also be invited to complete the main study, which includes
- 1-3 in-person visits to NIDA at the Johns Hopkins Bayview Campus in Baltimore
- •In-person visits comprise a full day of procedures, including two brain imaging (MRI) sessions at each visit, and an overnight stay in an on-campus clinical research unit the evening prior to the study visit
- •Compensation is about \$100 for the online only study, and \$335 to \$905 for completing the in-person imaging visits. NIDA will cover transportation expenses
- •If you participate in the imaging sessions, you will also receive a picture of your brain on a T-shirt
