Transportation

MSP International Airport (MSP) is 12 miles from the Hyatt Regency Minneapolis. The quickest way to get from Minneapolis Airport (MSP) to Hyatt Regency Minneapolis is a taxi or ride share option, which costs \$30.00–40.00 and takes 10–15 minutes. If you plan to use Uber, Lyft, or another app-based ride service, your ride will pick you up on Level 2 of the Green Parking Ramp, above the Ground Transport Center. Directional stanchion signs labeled “app-based ride services” will help you find your way to the pick-up area. The most cost-efficient way to get to the Hyatt Regency Minneapolis is the METRO Blue Line, and it will cost \$3.00 one way. This direct train departs from Terminal 1, Lindbergh Station every 15 minutes and operates daily. The Blue Line is the color train, and the stop you need to get off at is Nicollet Mall Station/5th Street. The train ride takes approximately 25 minutes. Once you arrive at Nicollet Mall Station/5th Street, head southwest on 2nd Ave N toward N 6th St and turn left. Take

6th Street .3 miles and then turn right onto Nicollet Ave/Nicollet Mall and walk .5 miles directly to the hotel. Walking to the hotel is approximately .9 miles and 20 minutes. While lower in cost, keep in mind this option will take about 45–55 minutes.
