The FSPHP-ETA™ program will encourage consistency and quality improvement among providers who work with this safety-sensitive population.

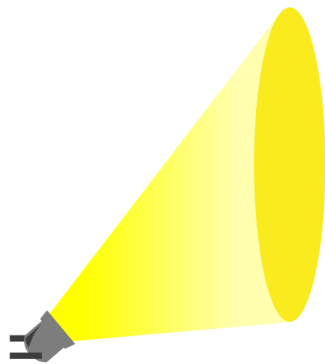
